About the presenter: Dr. John Porcerelli is a Professor of Psychology in the Doctoral Program in Clinical Psychology at University of Detroit Mercy. Prior to 2016, he served as Professor & Director of Behavioral Medicine, Dept. of Family Medicine & Public Health Science at Wayne State U. School of Medicine. He is board certified in Clinical Psychology and Clinical Health Psychology, a Fellow of the A.P.A., and a graduate of the Michigan Psychoanalytic Institute. He has authored/co-authored over 100 peer-reviewed articles and book chapters and has received research awards from the American Psychoanalytic Association, International Psychoanalytical Association, and Division 39 (Society for Psychoanalysis) of the A.P.A. His research includes the assessment of personality organization, physician-patient relationships, and process/outcome of psychoanalytic therapies. Dr. Porcerelli is also in private practice in Birmingham, MI.

Practice Gap Need and Course Description:

In this presentation, Dr. Porcerelli will describe the findings from the Longitudinal Study of Change (Cogan & Porcerelli, 2016, 2021), a naturalistic study of psychoanalysis, and how an empirical assessment of personality functioning can help clinicians assess patients for psychoanalysis as well as monitor progress and treatment outcome.

After attending this presentation, participants will be able to:

1. Describe the differences between effectiveness and efficacy studies of psychoanalytic therapies.
2. Describe the strengths of harnessing clinical judgement with reliable and valid clinician rating scales for the assessment of psychoanalysis.
3. Identify the pathological personality features that lessen as a function of psychoanalysis.
